

OTHER MILESTONES (continued)

- 1971 - 1972 -
New Trial Liturgies were used at the Holy Eucharist celebrations. We returned to the use of the Prayer Book services on the first Sunday in Advent, 1972.
- 1972 - May -
A new lock system for the church was being considered by the Vestry following several episodes of vandalism. A decision was made to lock the church.
- 1972 - June 7th -
The Vestry received a letter from the Evening Guild announcing its dissolution.
- 1972 - September 22 -
The Couples' Group, "Saints and Sinners", had its first social event of the year, a Champagne Party, held in the rectory.
- 1972 - December 2nd -
An "Old Fashioned Christmas Fair" was held in the Parish House. One of the highlights of the Fair was the Centennial Booth. Many people were interested in the display of historical memorabilia.
- 1972 -
Mr. John Tucker made and presented to the Junior Altar Guild, a pair of wooden candlesticks and a pair of matching flower vases, to be used on the Church School Altar.
- 1973 -
The Afternoon Guild held a "May Coffee" at which aprons, baked goods, plants and "white elephants" were sold.
- 1973 -
For many years Mrs. Blanche Jackson has faithfully represented All Saints', Scotch Plains, as its "Family United Thank Offering" Custodian. Her resignation in the Spring of '73 was accepted with regret. Mrs. John Roome succeeded Mrs Jackson in this capacity.
Mrs. William Brixius, after ten years of service as Directress of the Altar Guild, was succeeded by Mrs. William Waddington.
After many years of service in the Afternoon Guild, Mrs. J.E. Cazeneuve was succeeded by Mrs. Grace Mecke as president.
- 1973 -
As one means to raise money for the Church Centennial projects, plans were made by the Centennial Committee for a Flea Market to be held on September 8, 1973 outside and inside the parish house.
- 1973 -
The All Saints' Centennial Banquet is planned for Friday, November 2, and will be held in the Shackamaxon Country Club.
