During the fire departments 90th year of operation a dinner was held to commemorate the event. At this dinner three members were honored for their length of active service; Charles Sheelen, Jr. 50 years, William Mathews 49 years and John Kraus 49 years. Mr. Sheelen and Mr. Kraus are still active. They will be the Grand Marshalls of our 100th Anniversary Parade.

The year 1982 saw the borough order two new Mack diesel fire engines. The first, which was designated Engine 6, was a "quad" combination, cab over engine. It contained a 1250 gallon per minute pump, had a 600 gallon water tank, would hold over 2500 feet of hose and contained over 100 feet of ladders. The second, which was designated Engine 7, was a triple combination cab over engine. It contained a 1500 gallon per minute pump, had a 500 gallon water tank and would hold over 2500 feet of hose. These engines replaced Engine 4, which was sold by the borough and Engine 5, which was placed in reserve. These engines also are the present make-up of the fire department.



Engines 6 and 7, Mack diesel pumpers, were ordered in 1982 and make up the present fire department.
