



*Shingle style Victorian architecture was common in early Fanwood and was evident in the home of W.A. Gardner on North Avenue.*



*Built in 1790, John and Charles Kyte owned this home in the late 1800's and later their sister operated it as a boarding house in the 1890's. It was converted in the 1940's to a doctor's office and private residence.*



*In 1926 this was the residence of Thomas Norton, built in 1890 by A.D. Beeken, a member of Fanwood's first Borough Council.*
