


French style dormers set into a gambrel roof could be seen on the Thomas Preston residence on North Avenue.



A.I. Nichols, tax collector and holder of fire badge #1, resided at this home on North Avenue. The estate was sold, sub-divided and developed into Nichols Court, bearing the name of the original owner.

The names of several of our borough streets reflect the history of our community. Terrill Road, Martine Avenue, Coriell Avenue and Farley Avenue were named after old farms and early residents. The names Nichols Court and Saville Row are a tribute to the early residents whose homes still stand on these streets. The Gold Star streets were named to honor the Fanwood servicemen who gave their lives in the defense of our country. These streets of special recognition include Ashworth Court, Brohm Place, Burns Way, Gere Place, Ginder Place, MacDermott Place, MacLennon Road, Staggard Place, Stewart Place and Vinton Circle.



Martine Avenue in 1905 was a thoroughfare for carriages carrying visitors from the Fanwood Park railroad station to the Homestead Hotel.
