

The famous Terry well, located near the corner of Cooper and Rahway Roads. The well is famous through its association with the Battle of the Short Hills, June 26, 1777, when both Continental and British soldiers stopped to quench their thirst on that hot day and drank the well dry, which had never happened before.
