The Betsy Frazee house as photographed in 1889. Built in the early 1700s in Scotch Plains, the house and its original owner were made famous when Lord Cornwallis of the British army smelled the aroma of fresh-baked bread on his march in 1777. After requesting bread for his men, Betsy Frazee is said to have replied, "I give this, sir, in fear, not in love." The legend holds that Cornwallis then refused the bread by saying, "Then, neither I nor a soldier of mine shall eat it, Madam." All that day, the British troops passed her home but did not disturb her or ask her for a single loaf of bread. The house still stands at the corner of Rahway and Raritan Roads. Note the beehive oven on the right side of the house.
