

The Frazee Lee house presently located at 11 Black Birch Road, Scotch Plains. In fact, the house is made up of two historic homes joined together in 1828. The home includes two additions, one in 1950 and one in 1963. The larger, older section was built by Thomas Lee Senior and has been moved twice. It was originally located on the northeast corner of Cooper and Terrill Roads, and was moved by Samuel Lee in 1828 and joined to a smaller section built by Moses Frazee. It stood for two hundred years on the present Union County Vocational Technical School grounds. It was moved to its present location on Black Birch Road in 1963 when its second addition was built.



The home of William Stillger, located at 1818 Front Street in Scotch Plains. William was a bootmaker, and the grandfather of Marion Clark, who later resided here.
