



A map of New Jersey entered according to an Act of Congress in the year 1834 by T. Gordon in the Clerk's Office of the District Court of New Jersey. The map locates Scotch Plains in Essex County. Notice that Union County did not exist at the time. Also note the charts on the left, which show various routes by stage and steamboat. In the right lower corner, the population is given by county and decade. For instance, the population of Essex County in 1840 was 44,621. The entire population of New Jersey in 1840 was 373,306—an increase of 52,527 from 1830.
