

An 1855 map of New Jersey, published by J.H. Colton and Company of William Street, New York. It was #172, entered according to an Act of Congress in 1855 in the Clerk's Office of the District Court for the Southern District of New York. On this map, Scotch Plains is situated on the Jersey Central Railroad from Elizabeth to Clinton. The map is hand-colored and identifies the counties; Scotch Plains remains part of Essex County. Notice that although Fanwood is not yet indicated on the map, Feltville is depicted in the Watchung Mountains. (Map courtesy of the McManus family of Scotch Plains)
