# An Ordinance

TO REGULATE THE USE OF

## BICYCLES, TRICYCLES

AND COME AD VEHICLES AND OTHER ROAD VEHICLES,

In the Public Roads, Streets and Highways

### TOWNSHIP OF FANWOOD.

The Inhabitants of the Township of Fanwood by their Township Committee do enact as follows:

Section I. Sec. 2. That all Bicycles, Tricycles and similar Vehicles shall carry southflowed by the hand 100 feet diamet. Sec. 4. That no person shall ride upon any BICYCLE, tricycle of similar vehicle, of other road vehicle in any public road, street of highway of the township of fanwood at a greater speed than the rate of twelve miles per

Sec. 5. That every violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall render the OFFENDER subject to a fine not exceeding the sum of FIVE DOLLARS FOR EACH OFFENDER, and that the Justice of the Paces or other magistrates who may have jurisdiction over such oftences, in violation of this ordinance may impose such fine in his discretion as he may think proper, not exceeding the sum of FIVE Dollars for each offence.
