



**A CORNER VICTORIAN.** Dr. Frank Wescott was the first and only physician in Fanwood until 1924. Serving as borough physician for just \$1 per year, he also invested in real estate and enjoyed living in this Queen Anne-style home built in 1890. With its heavy cornice and trim, brackets under the eaves, and gable-and-hipped roof, it is a good example of the style prevalent in the late 19th century.



**THE J. P. STEVENS HOUSE.** The owner of several textile mills and founder of the textile company that bears his name, J. P. Stevens was also an active member of the community, serving in the Fanwood Fire Company in 1894. His home, built in 1896 on Forest Road, still stands proudly, surrounded by handsome trees and shrubs. The European Turkish red oak to the left of the property is the largest of its species in New Jersey.
