

CRAFTSMAN HOMES. The Craftsman style, characterized by gently sloping roofs and porches across the front, was often used in the early 20th century. Craftsman-style homes were usually one and a half stories high and were designed for low maintenance. Column supports, open-end rafters, and stone fireplaces also appeared in some of these houses. This home still stands on Russell Road, one of many examples of the style throughout the borough.



THE STEWART PLACE HOUSES. The Hand Lumber and Coal Company built 10 houses on this street and on Terrill Road c. 1905. Many of them became dwellings for the men who worked on the railroad and their families. The neighborhood was known as Handville among the residents.
