

THE POLICE CHIEF. William Logan served the borough for 15 years, starting as a night marshal for \$50 a month. Later, he provided borough protection during the day for an additional \$24 a month, plus a new uniform and a bicycle. Sadly, Chief Logan died when, while chasing hoboes on the railroad track, he was struck by a pusher engine running backward on the eastbound freight track.
