

THE FOUNDER. Known as the "Father of Fanwood," George Kyte was a prosperous merchant who devoted much of his spare time to the town. He was born in Berlin, British Guiana, in 1846. During his life of public service, he also served on the Fanwood Township Committee several times, held a position on the Union County Board of Freeholders, and was a representative in Congress from District 3 of Union County.
