

RESCUE SQUAD



An impatient stork winging its way in the dark of the night toward Scotch Plains—or, more somber, two cars crash on the highway—whatever the emergency, the Scotch Plains Rescue Squad is ready twenty-four hours a day, every day of the year.

The Rescue Squad was organized in 1937 on a voluntary basis. There are more than thirty members on call. Its headquarters on Bartle Avenue, dedicated in 1945, houses an ambulance and other equipment, such as an Iron Lung donated by the Scotch Plains Lions Club, oxygen equipment, hospital bed, wheel chairs, crutches, etc. This equipment is available, at no charge, to Scotch Plains residents. There are also two meeting rooms, a kitchen and an office.

The squad members hold American Red Cross First Aid cards.

The work of the squad is supported by the Community Chest, private gifts and a municipal contribution.
