

The Fanwood and Scotch Plains Y.M.C.A. at Grand and Union Streets, Scotch Plains, contains bowling alleys. Swimming classes for boys and girls are held at the Plainfield and Westfield Ys.

A list of facilities of the county park system runs to impressive length: Archery, badminton (lawn areas may be used, but players supply their own equipment), baseball diamonds, bathing, boating, boccie, camping, coasting, croquet, day camping (reservations should be made in advance) fishing in all park lakes and streams (state fishing license required except for children under 14), football fields, handball, hay rides, hiking, horseback riding (there are 25 miles of bridle paths in Watchung Reservation, open all year), ice skating, lawn bowling, model yacht sailing, skiing, sleigh riding, tobogganing and trap and skeet shooting.

For those who succumb to the lure of picnicking, it may be well to note sections in three of the many areas may be reserved by county residents. The others are on a first-come first-served basis. There are, of course, fireplaces, tables, and benches in all the areas. Picnic kits, containing game equipment, may be obtained without charge.

Hikers or cyclists, if sufficiently sharp-eyed and fortunate, may see deer, pheasants and other small game in the Watchung Reservation. Dogwood blossom time in the Reservation, and Japanese cherry trees when in bloom, adjacent to the lakes at Warinanco and Nomahegan, are special attractions.

The Trailside Museum is in a building near the Watchung Reservation Nursery. It is open afternoons (except Mondays) from 2 to 5 P.M. from the first Sunday in May to the last Sunday in October.

The township's Recreation Commission sponsors athletic leagues for the children, handicraft work, Halloween Parade, Christmas House Display contests and the like.
