TRANSPORTATION

With three railroads and many bus lines, Scotch Plains need not worry of becoming isolated.

The three railroads use the same tracks. The New Jersey Central trains afford frequent and fast-timed service for commuters to New York City, Westward, its trains head for Somerville, Easton, Pa., Bethlehem, Allentown and Scranton. The Reading Railroad provides service to Philadelphia as well as New York City. The Baltimore and Ohio gives through service to Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington and westward to Chicago or St. Louis.

Public Service Bus No. 49 connects Plainfield, Scotch Plains and Newark. Two Somerset Bus lines also go to Newark—the route of Bus No. 140 is Somerville, Plainfield, Scotch Plains and Newark, and Bus No. 141 starts at New Market and goes to Plainfield, Scotch Plains, Union and Newark. Somerset also run buses to New York City via Scotch Plains.

Another bus line to New York City is the Green Flyer Express, traveling between Fanwood, Linden, Newark and New York City.

For long distance bus traveling to any part of the United States there are the Greyhound Lines, Royal Blue, Martz, Edwards Lake to Sea and the Jersey Central Bus Company.
