Did you know that enrollment predictions indicate that there will be approximately 1,105 pupils over school capacity in 1963. Board of Education president, Mr. William Kitsz stated that as things stand now it will be necessary by September of 1962 to put some classes, probably sixth graders, on a double session. It will also be necessary to continue using the elementary schools' all-purpose rooms for classes thereby prolonging curtailment of assembly programs, muscial instruction and physical education classes.

A referendum has been proposed providing for construction of an elementary school opposite Scotchwood on the south side of town, also regionalization of the Scotch Plains and Fanwood school systems which would entitle both communities operating as one additional state aid in excess of two million dollars over a ten year period.
