NEXT YEAR'S PLANS: As most of you know we shall be sharing our building with the Kevin Road School for the first semester of next year. That is, Shackamaxon School will operate for four hours in the morning and the Kevin Rd. School will be in session for four hours in the afternoon, with their own faculty, principal, office, etc. Dr. Irving Bloom will be principal of the new Kevin Rd. School which we expect to open on February 1, 1964. Dr. Bloom is presently Director of Language Arts in the district.

Shack is Crowded!!!

Even with as many pupils as possible rezoned to the north, extra sections of 3 grade levels had to be made. This meant using Kindergarten rooms as classrooms and making 3 Kindergarten classes morning and afternoon of about 65 children each in the Auditorium at once. The adjoining kitchen is used to house their supplies and the stage for storage.

Let's look further. A storeroom full of a whole year's supplies is used for instrumental music, speech therapy, special totoring, and safety patrol meetings on a tight schedule. Speech testing was done in the halls. Nurses are shared and rotated among the schoo,; our share being about 3 half-days. The "sick room" also houses 2 duplicating machines and their supplies, the record and filmstrip libraries, and also serves as office and conference room for the 5 directors of instruction when in school. Faculty Lounge is used for tutoring, special testing, and teachers' lunch room. Those children needing remedial reading are taught a few at a time in a cubicle of a converted broom closet. Bookroom is a tiny ex-closet. Lavatories are on a very tight schedule. No room for a central library and no empty auditorium adds more books, lunch-eating, physical education instruction, and vocal music (to a traveling organ) to each room. There is no opportunity for our children to come together at any time for assemblies, gym, etc.
