The Shackamaxon school library officially started circulating books on Thursday, September 26th. Mrs. Muriel Blum, our teacher-librarian, whom we share with Coles School, has conducted two training sessions for parents to show them how to handle circulation and shelving. She has also scheduled a library orientation period for the teachers and has taken classes into the library on an informal basis as the need arose in the classrooms. In addition, Mrs. Blum is conducting a regular class every other week for children in grades 2-6. During the alternate weeks, children visit the Library for the exchange of books--this phase of the program being under the direction of the classroom teacher. The children in Kindergarten and grade 1 will also visit the library, but on an invitational basis.

The lovely fiberglass draperies and the illuminated globe were purchased for the library by the P.T.A. Walnut chairs and study tables help make the library a most pleasant place to browse and study.

Many thanks to the willing mothers who spent time last Spring preparing the books, filing cards and arranging books on the shelves. We have a library of which we are all very proud.
