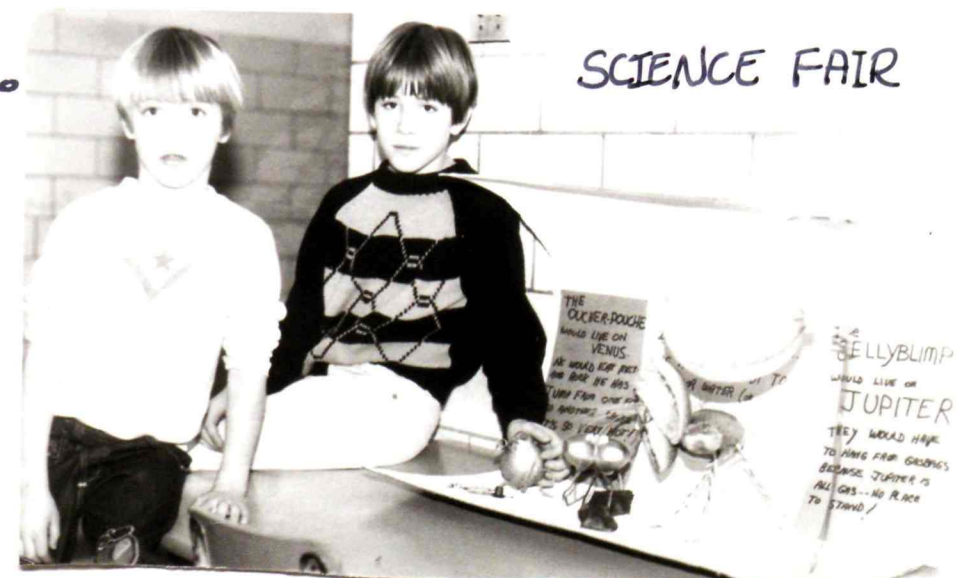
stration, a luncheon for six, an afternoon of sailing, and many handcrafted items.
