STORIES of New Jersey

The memorial consists of three rough-hewn stones. On the top stone is a bronze plate inscribed:

Captain Joshua Huddy, Monmouth County Artillery, a prisoner of war, captured March 24, 1782, while defending the Block House at Toms River. He was hanged by Tories without warrant, April 12, 1782. The British authorities repudiated but did not atone for the crime -- Sons of the Revolution in New Jersey.
