## SIXTH WAR LOAN CAMPAIGN GETS UNDER WAY.

With W. Seward Lyon and Wm. Sampson as co-chairmen, the organization of the Scotch Plains Sixth War Loan campaign got off to an enthusiastic a rally at School One on 14th. F. Irving Walsh, start with November 14th. chairman of the War Loan campaign in the Plainfield area, and H. Douglas Davis, County Chairman, were the principal speakers. Mr. Walsh announced that a quota of \$100,000. had been accepted by Scotch Plains.
