Under the direction of Mr. Ray Callaghan, the S.P.H.S. track team had another banner year. Among the outstanding achievements of our track team were the state records established by Captain Williams and Bob Gruninger. At the state meet at Montclair, Tom came in first in the half mile. His time was 2:00.7 seconds. Bob Gruninger duplicated Williams' feat by running the mile in 4:38.2 seconds. The class of "47" extend their congratulations to Captain Tom Williams and Bob Gruninger. Traveling to Long Branch, Scotch Plains High School entered Williams, Weber, Pupa and Gruninger in the Medley Relay. The boys just missed establishing a state record when they were nosed out by a group four school. Larger schools came back to jinx Scotch Plains High School in the Penn Relay in which we took second, losing to another group four school. When the season came to a completion Scotch Plains High School was undefeated in dual meets, winning over North Plainfield, Pingry, Rutgers Prep, Bound Brook, and Metuchen.

Scotch Plains High School's 1946 baseball team, coached by Mr. Limoli, witnessed one of its most successful seasons in a number of years. The squad compiled a record of 6 wins and 5 losses. The season opened with a victory 4-3 over a well balanced North Plainfield nine, with John Nettingham's 10th inning double providing the winning run. In the return game a new pitching sensation was discovered in Bob Kraus, who pitched eight and one-third innings of scoreless ball for the second win over North Plainfield. After dropping few close games, the team continued its victories by defeating Cranford 3 to 2 with Graves pitching sparkling ball. Mc-Dede's bunt gave S.P.H.S. another 1-run victory when Rutgers Prep visited us. Later Prep was defeated at New Brunswick by 3-2. The climax of the season came when S.P.H.S. collected 14 hits to route St. Mary's. Pete McDede led the batters with a mark of .364, followed by Tony Tittanegro and Chip Sanguliano. Bob Kraus led the pitchers with a record of 4 wins and 1 defeat, followed by Grave's 2 and 3, followed by Pupa's 0-1 record.

The Freshmen and Junior Varsity also witnessed a successful season under the coaching of Mr. Devereux and Mr. Keller.
