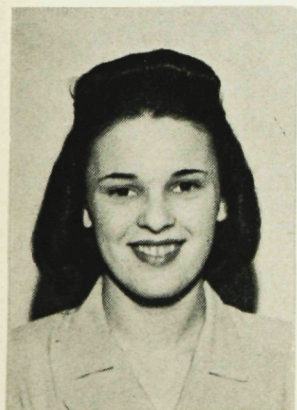
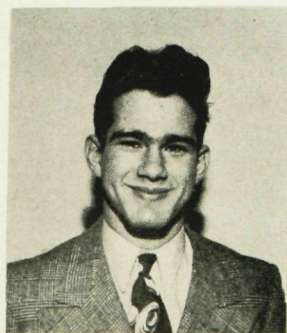




Moonglowers
