



Although Latin, French, and Spanish were all offered at Scotch Plains-Fanwood High School, French dominated the other languages for four years because it was being taught at the Junior High. Those who began with Conversational French in eighth grade and French I as Freshmen usually studied French in high school. The Spanish Department was suffering from lack of students. This year, however, the first tenth graders to have taken Spanish in the ninth grade continued in the three Sophomore Spanish II classes. They will have the opportunity of developing a better command of the language in speech, listening and reading comprehension, and writing and of studying it more intensively in the remaining three years of high school.
