
New Stadium, One of Best in State

At last Scotch Plains-Fanwood High's home games were played at home. Long missing its own track and football field, in 1967, Scotch Plains could boast about having one of the finest athletic complexes in New Jersey. Built several hundred yards behind the school, in years to come, a city road will pass near enough to the stadium to make it more accessible.

The new stadium certainly boosted athletics both at S.P.F.H.S. and in Union County. The Grastex composition track made possible several new track events. The school held a Scotch Plains Invitational Relay Meet in the winter, and the Union County Relay, previously held at Westfield, took place in the new stadium. It would have been difficult for there to have been an increase in attendance at football games, but the stadium was at least one reason for the high degree of school spirit present among students—it gave one more reason to yell, "We're from Scotch Plains; nobody's prouder!"
