Home Ec Provides Foundation for Developing Responsibility

Much frustration goes into the sewing of a garment for Clothing class, but the end result is a blouse or dress that the girl is proud to model in a fashion show. Three clothing courses are offered, ranging from the use and care of a sewing machine to the making of dresses, suits, and coats. Clothing I gives the student experience in basic fundamentals while Clothing II and III explore more advanced construction problems and also emphasize budgeting the clothing dollar.

Those tempting aromas in one of the halls are provided by none other than the Foods classes, a second segment of the Home Ec. Department. Basic cooking techniques, table setting, and principles of cooking are taught in Foods I. In the second year students learn canning and freezing as well as planning economical, nutritious meals. In the third year social skills along with sectional cookery in the United States are explored.

Family Living, the third phase of the department, offers a foundation in developing responsibility within a family. Budgeting a hypothetical income and child care are emphasized.
