
Foreign Language Department

To achieve "a love for language" and a meaningful and practical usage of a foreign language for students are the goals of the Foreign Language Department. This year, the department added semester courses to the senior program in an effort to allow students to study a language for a semester, rather than the usual full year course. These new courses, such as a Current Events course, were chosen to attract interest from seniors. Tapes, filmstrips, games, and magazines were made available to language students who wished to increase their knowledge and understanding of the French, Spanish, German, and Russian languages. A basic Latin course was also offered this year. A Language Lunch program was organized in which students were able to eat lunch in the independent study area while conversing in a foreign language among friends and teachers. Language students were offered a course in teaching elementary children and received credit for it. In the Spring, the students visited countries in Europe. The Foreign Language Department strives to have students gain an understanding of a language and to make it an enjoyable part of their lives.
