

GETTING SO MUCH BETTER ALL THE TIME!

The Varsity Basketball Team posted a respectable 14-11 season record, advancing to the quarterfinal round in the State sectional tournament where it dropped a 78-58 decision to Shabazz, one of two new members of the Watchung Conference. In the opening round of the Sectionals, team MVP Todd Kylish narrowly missed a "triple double" with 27 points, 17 rebounds, and 7 assists from the power forward position. With only two players over 6 feet in height —

Todd at 6'3" and junior Gerald Rawles at 6'1" — the Raiders had to rely upon guile and quickness in order to win. Junior guard Craig McCoy led the team with 75 assists and, more important, a scrappy 56 steals. Tom Kelly's outside jump shot and quick hands — he finished the season with only four fewer assists than Craig — complimented senior Calvin McCoy's impressive season

totals in assists, rebounds, and steals. Todd Kylish led the team in both points scored (19.2 avg.), 479, and in rebounds, 197. The Raiders will graduate several prominent players in June — Todd, Tom, Calvin — but has a reserve of juniors and sophomores — Craig, Gerald, Joe Robinson, and Drew Mahoney — around which Coach Willie Leonardi may build a solid team for 1990-91.
