The 2005 Culmen, volume 64, is the second all-color yearbook of Scotch Plains Fanwood High School. The 750 copies of the 328 page yearbook were printed by Jostens Publishing Company at their State College, Pennsylvania, facility. The pages were designed and created by members of the photo journalism class using 24 Dell computers with Adobe InDesign CS, Adobe Photoshop CS, and Jostens Yeartech. Photographs were taken digitally and conventionally by **Normandy Studios** of Plainfield, NJ, and by members of the yearbook staff. The cover was designed by **Rick Brooks**. *Changing Faces Facing Change* was chosen to convey that our school spirit remained the same although our school mascot changed faces. We faced the change and accepted it. In addition, for the first time, the yearbook was sold via purchaseyouryearbook.com.
