

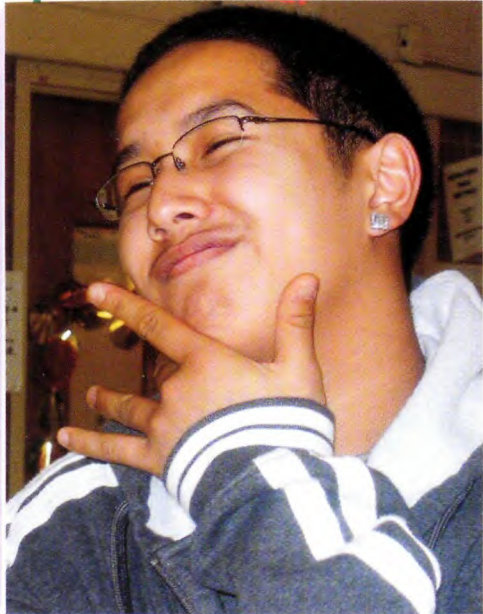
woebetide

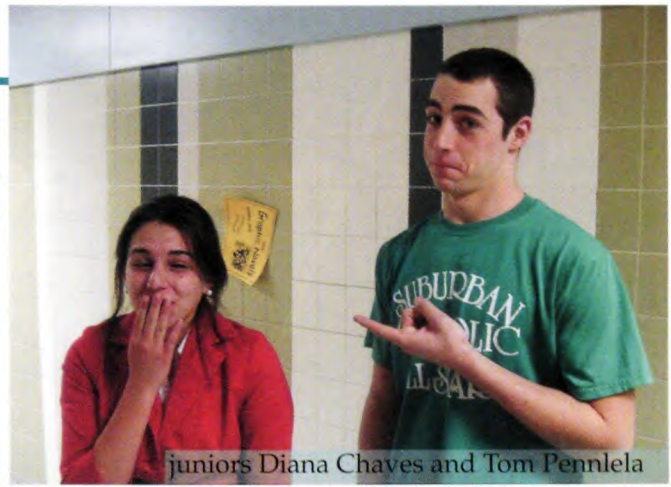
shawday
