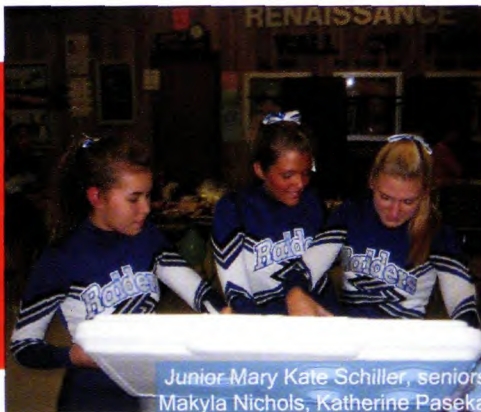
## erving the cause
